LIBERAL ARTS CERTIFICATE

The Certificate is designed to recognize students who, during their first year of University level studies, have followed a curriculum consistent with the liberal arts tradition. In this tradition, students are introduced to a relatively wide range of subjects in order to acquire knowledge and intellectual capacities that are general to all walks of life.

The Liberal Arts certificate can stand alone or be used towards any Bachelor of Arts program or the Diploma in Liberal Arts.

Courses taken in the U of R Liberal Arts Certificate may also be used to participate in transfer programs or to apply for advanced credit standing at a variety of different universities. Potentially a Liberal Arts Certificate may be applied to programs in:

- Law
- Media, Art and Performance
- Dentistry, Medicine and Nursing
- Nutrition
- Veterinary Medicine

Students interested in transfer or advanced credit standing at an alternative university are required to consult an advisor at the alternative university of their choice to obtain accurate information on admission or transfer requirements and processes.
