

# Southeast College Pathways Scholarship

The Pathways Scholarship was established with the purpose of creating a pathway for success for Southeast College Adult Basic Education graduates wishing to pursue a full-time post-secondary education at Southeast College.

**\$1,000 each to 10 recent Southeast College Adult Basic Education graduates enrolled in a full-time post-secondary program at Southeast College.**

## To be eligible for a Pathways Scholarship, students must:

- Graduate from a Southeast College Adult Basic Education course within two academic years of enrolling in their chosen full-time post-secondary program.
- Register and be accepted or conditionally accepted into their chosen full-time post-secondary program by the Southeast College Registrar before June 30<sup>th</sup>, 2023.
- Awards will be based 100% on academic achievement. Academic achievement will be based on the student submitted enrollment transcripts. There is no additional application necessary.

## How to apply for the Pathways Scholarship: ([Deadline: June 30, 2023](#))

Recent Adult Basic Education graduates who are accepted or conditionally accepted to their chosen full-time post-secondary program delivered through any Southeast College campus prior to June 30<sup>th</sup>, 2023 will be automatically eligible for the Pathways Scholarships.

## How the Pathways Scholarship is awarded:

The Pathways Scholarship will be awarded to successful recipients at the midpoint of their program provided the recipient is enrolled in and regularly attending classes.

Successful award recipients will receive a letter before their program start date. This letter will serve as a notification to students as to the value of their award, and how the award will be processed. Students who have an outstanding balance on their student account at the time of award payment will have their award credited towards their student account. Students who have a zero balance on their student account at the time of award payment will have the award paid directly to the student. Students who have a third-party agency paying their tuition must submit documentation showing tuition will be paid in full prior to award payment if they wish to have the award paid directly to the student.
